

#### **DEFINITION**

Domestic Violence or intimate partner violence is a pattern of assaultive and coercive behaviors including:

- Inflicted physical injury
- Psychological abuse
- Sexual assault

- Progressive social isolation
- Stalking
- Deprivation
- Intimidation and threats

### Cycle of Violence Phase 1: Tension Building Phase 2: Phase 3: **Violent** Honeymoon Explosion

#### Phase 1: Tension Building

#### Abuser:

- Yells
- Criticizes
- Threatens
- Humiliates

Victims describe as "walking on eggshells"

#### Phase 2: Violent Explosion

#### Abuser:

Abuses victim physically, emotionally and/or sexually.

#### Phase 3: Honeymoon

#### Abuser:

- Acts like nothing ever happened
- Makes promises
- Pleads for forgiveness
- Cries
- Buys gifts

#### Homeless Shelter vs. DV Shelter

#### Differences:

- Confidentiality the least amount of people that know the location the better!
- Safety of Clients someone is probably looking for them!

## Impact of DV on Health and School Performance




- School Failure

- More school nurse visits
- Referral to a school speech pathologist
- Lower grade point averages
- School suspension

Teens: Children: Runaway Bed wetting Substance **Nightmares** abuse Both: Parentification Violence/ Aggression Acting out or withdrawing Lying

### Childhood and Teen Challenges: Physical



- Frequently Sick
- Somatic Complaints
- Nervous, anxious, short attention span
- Tired and lethargic
- Regression in development
- High risk play
- Self abuse

## Tips for working with children affected by trauma

- Recognize bad days and have a transition activity.
- Learn each child's name and use it often.
- Be on time.
- Interact without judgment.
- Recognize that this is a temporary living situation.
- Don't take it personal.
- Take care of yourself!
